SENATOR FITZGERALD: I make a motion to lay it over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there objection? Okay. Do you want to put the motion, Senator Fitzgerald?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is to lay over LB 361. Is that the motion?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Would this take 30 votes since it is changing the Speaker's order?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No. The Speaker's order is not being... I'm not changing the order that you need to vote on. It's just a motion. Any other questions? Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I missed part of the debate this afternoon, the first time I've been off the floor this season, and I would like to ask, I guess, Senator Wesely a question, if he is around, or perhaps Senator Warner, if he's not. What happened with the Wesely amendment when it was defeated on your bill, or was it Landis....that has to do with the transportation in outstate Nebraska?

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR KAHLE: Where are we at with that now?

SENATOR LANDIS: Okay, it's in 361. It's not in 722.

SENATOR KAHLE: Well, my purpose then in speaking is that I think that is a necessary part of our existence out in outstate Nebraska and if you want to kill 361 you will also kill the transportation that we have for our elderly the way it is set up now, and I just wanted to make this clear and hope that you would at least leave that much of 361 intact, rather than kill the whole thing. Would either one of you care to comment?

SENATOR LANDIS: I'm sorry, please continue.

SENATOR KAHLE: Where are we at and how can we remedy the situation that I just mentioned?

SENATOR LANDIS: Okay, I was answering a question from
