SENATOR NEWELL: Yes. Mr. President and members of the body, this amendment is one that I understand there is no opposition to. It is an amendment to put back into the bill the provision that one can make half of their money and still receive the unemployment comp. With that explanation, this was in the bill previously, it was taken out and now it is agreed to that it should go back in. With that, I urge the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the Newell amendment. Senator Dworak, your light is still on. Is there any discussion? If not, the question before the House is the Newell amendment. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes. I would like to Call the House.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 4 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All legislators will take their seats and please check in. Would you all check in, please? All legislators will return to their seats under Call of the House. We have got twenty of them that have not checked in yet. Please check in. The question before the House is the Newell amendment to LB 800. Pirsch, Keyes, Schmit, Senator George, will you please check in.

SENATOR NEWELL: Could we accept some call-in votes?

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR NEWELL: Could we...I would like to accept call-in votes on the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the Newell amendment to LB 800. Call-ins have been accepted.

CLERK: Senator Kelly voting aye. Senator Vickers voting aye. Senator Marsh voting aye. Senator George voting no.
