SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Lewis amendment to 848. Senator Newell, your light is on. We have ceased debate, right. CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell now moves to amend the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President and members of the body, this amendment would raise from the \$10 registration fee to the \$15 registration fee. The additional \$5 is to pay for the cost of the secretarial work that goes to the application of the fees. The way the bill reads presently there is no increase in license fees at all. The license fees will remain exactly as they are. We are not separating class C license and so this fee would just pay for the registration for secretarial work that goes into the yearly application fees.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Newell, do you have a copy of your amendment that I could look at? I would like to look at it if I could. You say it only raises the registration fee from ten to fifteen dollars. That's all it does.

SENATOR NEWELL: I'm on now. Section 6 is out of the bill per your amendment. This raises the registration fee from ten to fifteen dollars. This is the yearly registration fee. It is in order to pay for the secretarial work that goes to filling out the licenses each year in the cases of long and the short forms.
