632A. It is on page 1314 of the Journal.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this amendment merely reflects the reduction in revenue as a result of the reduction in the per gallon fee that would be charged for the processing of the product. I move the adoption of the amendment. It also has the emergency clause. It actually results in reduction of cost.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have amendments to 632A? Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Schmit amendments to 632A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is adopted...the motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Now do you want to advance the bill?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the bill be advanced as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, 651.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 651.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments to LB 651.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Merz has an amendment. Senator Nichol is going to handle the amendment for him. It's on page 1131 of the Journal.
