CLERK: Yes, sir. Yes, ready to advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Merz, do you wish to advance the bill?

SENATOR MERZ: Mr. President and members, I think this horse has had a long enough ride. Let's move the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 651 to E & R for Review. Engrossment. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Say aye, then, okay. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, 844.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, right before that I have an Attorney General's Opinion addressed to Senator Johnson on LB 361. (See pages 1763 through 1766 of the Legislative Journal.)

Senator Lewis would like to print amendments to 533. (See page 1767 of the Journal.) Senator Keyes to 722. (See pages 1766 and 1767 of the Journal.) Senator Koch to 824. (See page 1766 of the Journal.) And Senator Lewis to 848. Mr. President, 844, there are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the E & R amendments to 844. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Senator Murphy now moves to amend the bill, Mr. President. (Read the Murphy amendment as found on page 1767 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Would you believe that Mr. Schimek and I are in agreement for the first time in eight years? He concurs with this amendment and it is simply to clarify that where we are saying that in a merged district the teacher from the merged school shall be represented by, that we are not confusing it to say that the Legislature is mandating that they shall join a union if they desire not to do so. It is clarifying language. In fact, it was written by Mr. Schimek and I have got sore eyes from reading it to see where the hole is. But I move the adoption of the amendment.
