LB 694, 989A

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of 694. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed. The bill is advanced. We will now take up 989A. He wants a machine vote and it is too late. Senator Reutzel, what are you standing up for? Tired of sitting down.

SENATOR REUTZEL: That's partly it. No, Senator Cullan did call for a machine vote.

SENATOR CLARK: I'm sorry, I didn't hear him. If it is all right with the rest we will have a machine vote.

SENATOR REUTZEL: We understand the problem but we would like a....

SENATOR CLARK: We will have a machine vote on the advancement of 694. All those in favor of advancing 694 vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Pardon me? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is still advanced. We will now take up 989A. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, 989A...we advanced 989 a couple of minutes ago. This is the A bill that needs to go with it. There is an amendment on the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Read the amendment.

CLERK: (Read the Goodrich amendment as found on page 1768 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, when we strike section 1 of the bill we reduce the cost of the A bill by \$18,750. I move the adoption of the amendment. Remember, we reduce the cost by 18,000 if we adopt the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Goodrich amendment. Is there any discussion? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Goodrich's amendment.
