SENATOR GOODRICH: I move the bill be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move the bill be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is to advance 989A. Is there any discussion? If not, that is the question before the House. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed say no. Thank you. The bill is advanced. The Clerk has some things to read in.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Simon would like to print amendments to LB 175, Senator DeCamp to 954A. (See pages 1768 through 1771.) Senator Warner would like to print some material regarding the Governor's veto of 996 and 997. (See pages 1772 and 1773 of the Legislative Journal.)

Senator Simon would like to print amendments to LB 627. (See page 1771 of the Journal.)

SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will take up LB 889.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 889. There are no E & R amendments to the bill. The first amendment I have is from Senator Schmit to put the emergency clause on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I so move, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there discussion on Senator Schmit's amendment? Senator Landis. The question before the House is the adoption of the Schmit amendment. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment, Mr. President.

Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Lamb. Would you like me to read it, Senator? It's on page 1721 of the Journal.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, this amendment is strictly clarification. It makes it perfectly clear that those people who market or distribute commercial fertilizer or soil conditioners in the State of Nebraska have to register their products. I move the adoption of the amendment.
