SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

CLERK: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is...Senator Carsten moves to bracket LB 627 on Select File. Senator Carsten wishes to withdraw. Mr. President, Senator Stoney has an amendment. Senator Stoney wants to withdraw. Mr. President, Senator Fitzgerald. Senator Fitzgerald wishes to withdraw. Mr. President, Senator Dworak has an amendment designated as number one.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Could I ask, does Senator Dworak have about four amendments up there?

CLERK: Yes, sir, he does.

SENATOR LAMB: All right. Before he left for Grand Island, he asked me to, and that is the amendment that I put up there....I believe it is number four.

CLERK: Okay.

SENATOR LAMB: I believe Senator Dworak would like to withdraw the other amendments and this is the amendment to Senator Koch's amendment primarily. I will have to apologize for not being completely knowledgeable about the amendment, but Senator Dworak told me that this was the Governor's proposal which he had asked Senator Dworak to present to the Legislature.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

SENATOR KOCH: I was only going to point out that my amendment hasn't been adopted so his would be out of order and I have no objection for him to put it on once the amendment is adopted, or try to put it on.
