SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, the only thing I am trying to do since this is the last day, Mr. Clerk, if I am right, where we can go to General File, I try to make it as fair as possible to those of you who have bills on General File that you would at least like to have touched, brought up. Senator Kahle, do you want to attempt fifteen minutes like we did yesterday or the day before?

SENATOR KAHLE: I think that would be more fair but I don't want to tell you what to do, Mr. Speaker. You have been working at this and you have more problems than any of us realize but would it be more fair to work on General File this morning and then go to Select File this afternoon and try to get some of those bills so we could get them to the Governor before the....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, we have another problem which I just as well share with you now so you have the whole load of hay. First of all, what we propose to do right now to talk about the problem that we all face and that is that we need to bring, go down to your worksheet on Final Reading, you have 1002 and the motion will be made in a few moments to, Senator Warner, the motion will be made to bring the bill back for amendments. Now in addition to this, Senator Kahle, if you will follow the worksheet, on Final Reading we are hopeful, and this is going to take some doing, we are hopeful to start with Final Reading on 485A before the day is over and go through at least to 819A. We need to attempt to accelerate the process so that the Appropriations Committee has some idea of the impact of some of these "A" bills. We will have a list of bills on Final Reading that will be distributed to you. Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker, when you was reading these numbers we have a very, very good bill there Chris and I have got and you never mentioned 858. You went from 630, then you went over to...
