SPEAKER MARVEL: That is fine with me.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan, your light was on.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would move that we alter the Speaker's agenda and proceed with Select File after LB 1002 and not proceed with General File. I am most reluctant to rise and oppose the agenda of the Speaker but I believe that the workload on Select File is tremendous, and if we continue to add things to Select File without moving there that we are going to be in trouble on Select File. I don't see anything on General File at all that can't wait until 1981 and I just think it would save us all a lot of...I think it would save the people of the State of Nebraska perhaps the danger of passing bad legislation without ample consideration and I really believe in my own mind that it is better for the people of the State of Nebraska if we pass what is left on Select File, or work on that, at least, rather than try to rush too many things through at the end. I admire the Speaker for the way he has proceeded and I admire the way you have handled this session, Mr. Speaker, but I simply think that we are trying to accomplish too much and I believe that we had better chew on what we have on Select File so I respectfully urge that the agenda be changed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan, I hate to take advantage of sitting up here but I would like to make this comment, that if we could go through about eight bills on General File and see how the process works, I think it might be helpful. We have got two days...where is the Clerk? We have what, Monday and Tuesday, for Select File, is that right? Okay, I think we should proceed and then if you have individual questions, why don't you come on up here and talk about it. Excuse me. May we proceed and then if you have questions, come on up. Senator Warner, do you want to make the motion to bring 1004 back please?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President, I will move to return LB 1002 for specific amendment. I have got a bit of a problem, Pat. There is four or five amendments filed on there. I don't think ours is first or is ours first?
