SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, I would appreciate it very much. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Maresh. Where did Senator Maresh go? Senator Maresh, do you wish to be recognized? Okay. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, Mr. President, I am just about the most cooperative individual when it comes to state aid and this kind of thing there is but I want to get some answers and I have got a sheet here. It says examples of aid level at the various funding levels. It says actual present, for example, and just to make it simple let's take Neligh, the second one on the list. It says \$53,576 and then we go over to the far column and it says \$147,863. Does that mean under 486 formula, okay, what would Neligh get under present formula with \$75 million? It is not going to be \$53,576 as I read it because we had something called evaluation and we changed all the works. This is just what they got last year, isn't it?

SENATOR KOCH: That is correct.

SENATOR DeCAMP: So the most critical figure of all for everybody is missing. How do I get that figure?

SENATOR KOCH: Well, somewhere in my file I think I have that and Neligh gets less.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, that is what I want to know, I mean, where we are. It seems if we are going to change a formula and put money in we should know where we are, and this actual present doesn't mean jack diddly doo because it has nothing to do with anything after evaluation. And in the past whenever you worked on formulas for us, Gerry, you have always given us complete printouts of what we are going to get under A, what we are going to get under B, and what we are going to get under C, and I have just waited this year anxiously to see when it is going to go.

SENATOR KOCH: We gave you one under \$130 million, Senator DeCamp, of all your schools.
