LB 991, 992

CLERK: The motion is to suspend Rule 6, Section 3, Rule 7, Section 3 and vote without further debate, without further amendment on the advancement of LB 991.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: Senator Barrett.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. Speaker, I have been an exceptionally good sport throughout the entire second session. I respectfully request that you reverse the roll call on this vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. I will attempt to be polite for the rest of the session. Your request is granted. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 1803-1804 of the Legislative Journal.) 37 ayes, 8 nays to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The rules are suspended. Now the motion is to advance 991 to E & R for review.

SENATOR NICHOL: I so move.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: We will have no opportunity then to vote on committee amendments?

SPEAKER MARVEL: That is right. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed no, the motion to advance the bill. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1804 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is advanced. The next bill, 992.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 992 was introduced by Senator Dave Newell and Senator Kelly. (Read title.) The bill was read on March 3, referred to Judiciary. The bill was advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, Senator Kelly, did you want to take this for a little bit?
