That is what was involved there.

SENATOR COPE: Well, let's stop and give somebody else some more time. I'm not too well satisfied with the answer though.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: A question of the Clerk.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR MURPHY: Patrick, can I get an instant replay of my discussion on this debate when we pass this turkey?

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I just can't help but comment again that here we have created another tax, which is a typical governmental solution to a problem, and the tax goes to primarily support bureaucracy and there is no money left to pick up litter or to educate people or anything else. This was a bad bill two years ago and it is still a bad bill today. Senator Cullan and Senator Hoagland had a little bit of an amendment on 965 to make it a little more credible but again the lobby was too well oiled and too well greased to get across to any kind of sensible sanity in this particular piece of legislation. I'm not addressing specifically the A bill, I'm fully aware of that, Senator DeCamp, but I think that you ought to take a look at the dollars. They are just revolving fund dollars, but essentially what we are ending up doing is taxing the people. The money goes to a bureaucracy, there is really no effective solution that can possibly come from this. It is just another government harassment. I don't know whether you are listening to the people or not, but I think that they have had enough of it and here we are perpetuating a mistake that we made two years ago, continuing the same thing and it is still bad policy.
