SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I would like to repeat that there is a motive behind what I am trying to do. LB 891, as you all know was on General File 4th or 5th on the list for many, many weeks. I'm being very truthful with you when I say that this is one of the reasons that I would like a couple more hours of General File. SPEAKER MARVEL: We are talking about the. . . .

SENATOR KEYES: I want to know which agenda we are going on, the mornings or the afternoons?

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are talking about staying on General File as we have discussed the matter up to now.

SENATOR KEYES: In other words what we are doing is going on the afternoons agenda not the mornings agenda.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well the morning agenda I would assume has already been covered.

SENATOR KEYES: I thought that it had some bills on it here that I read that I have got some crosses by.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I was talking about the bills that you added in 738, 738A, 891, that is the sheet that I am talking about.
