CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the Landis amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman now moves to amend the bill. Senator Haberman, it is request 2348, Senator.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and fellow legislators, the sheriffs and the deputies out in my territory get mighty mighty cold out there in that snow without their uniforms. What this amendment does...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me, for what purpose do you arise, Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Raise a point of order, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: State your point.

SENATOR CULLAN: I believe that this is Senator Haberman's infamous uniform-uniform bill and I believe that it is not germane to the subject matter. The subject matter deals with training and salaries for sheriffs. It does not have to do with the color, size and shape of the clothing that they happen to wear so I believe that it is not germane.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thanks, Sam, I will remember that. Mr. President, this deals with the sheriffs and their office and I think that it is as germane as can be.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair would make this observation, Senator Haberman. Then you can do as you see fit.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, I am not going to do that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: This goes to the same section but it covers another issue and therefore, the Chair rules that it is not germane.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, I will accept your ruling. I won't try to overrule it.
