SENATOR NEWELL: Until July 1, and that is all it does? Otherwise then it reverts back?

SENATOR WARNER: After that, after July 1 then they qualify for a tax exempt status as all other state agencies do and in the process of buying construction or something they designate a purchasing agent, identical... What it eliminates is the 60-40 arbitrary split which is what I don't like at all.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay, so, Senator Kahle, could I just ask you a question?

SENATOR KAHLE: Yes, Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: So basically the Warner amendment just provides getting through this year and then we go back to what we agreed to at the meeting that we had? Is that correct?

SENATOR KAHLE: As near as I know that is correct, yes.

SENATOR NEWELL: All right, thank you, Senator Kahle.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on the Warner amendment to 666? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The amendment is adopted. Do you have any more amendments?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, I think we have discussed the bill. I think it is a good bill. I move that it be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: All those in favor of advancing LB 666 to E & R say aye, opposed. The bill is advanced. LB 280.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have no E & R amendments to LB 280. Senator Murphy has an amendment pending.
