SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp, what do you want to do with 280?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Move the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, the motion before the House is the advancement of 280. All those in favor say aye, all those opposed no. The bill is advanced. LB 823. Senator Chambers, for what reason do you arise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am the chairman of the committee that offered this bill and it is to be taken off the list. You might see it in brackets up there? It is not to be considered.

SENATOR CLARK: 823?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: All right. 882. That is probably just a noncontroversial bill.

CLERK: May I read some stuff?

SENATOR CLARK: He wants to read some things in first.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and engrossed LB 627 and find the same correctly engrossed; 722 correctly engrossed; 722A correctly engrossed; LB 848 correctly engrossed and LB 1002 correctly engrossed, (Signed) Senator Wesely.

Mr. President, LB 902 (sic.) I have a series of amendments on the bill. The first...we have E & R amendments that need to be adopted.

SENATOR CLARK: The committee...what bill?

CLERK: E & R, Senator, 882.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments to LB 882.

SENATOR CLARK: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye, those opposed. The committee amendments are adopted. What is the next amendment?
