SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, because the issue is so important I ask for a roll call vote, Call of the House. It takes a simple majority as I understand it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A majority of those present, Senator DeCamp. Okay, clear the board. Excuse me?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Just call the roll. You don't need a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, a roll call is requested. Call the roll. The motion once again is shall the Chair be overruled. Go ahead.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1819 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 24 nays to overrule the Chair, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Senator Newell, do you wish to withdraw your amendments?

SENATOR NEWELL: Well we have a vote that I would like to go through with and then after that I'll offer the withdrawal of some of the amendments.

CLERK: Senator, you do want to submit the amendment we discussed to a vote then. Is that correct?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I would like to have a vote on that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: On page 1633 of the Journal there is a Newell amendment #1 and if you would like to look at it. This is the one you read, wasn't it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, it is.

SENATOR NEWELL: Could you read it one more time so that people remember what we are talking about?

CLERK: Mr. President, the Newell amendment reads as follows: (Read.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell. Do you want to discuss the amendment?

SENATOR NEWELL: I have already offered it and I have already closed on it but I just would say that it does not hurt the bill at all. In fact, it improves the bill by allowing some additional time to do the mechanical work.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Newell amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed
