SENATOR CLARK: Would the Clerk read the amendment, the Keyes' amendment?

CLERK: (Read Keyes amendment as found on page 1820 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CLARK: You have heard the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on the amendment? Call the vote.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt.

SENATOR CLARK: The amendment failed. Go back to the Nichol amendment. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Am I closing, sir?

SENATOR CLARK: Oh, Senator Newell wants to talk. Senator Fowler wants to talk.

SENATOR NICHOL: Why don't I just wait and close.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Beutler is first though, I'm sorry.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Nichol, just a quick question or two if I may. The amendment speaks of earth moving equipment and it talks of the type of equipment that is used primarily for agricultural or soil conservation purposes. I assume that the same piece of equipment, the very same piece of equipment if it is used for one purpose is exempt and if it is used for another purpose it is not? If it is used for agricultural purposes it is exempt. Why?
