vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye. 28 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate has ceased. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Just to remind the body that the purpose of this motion is to suspend the rules and allow a vote to be taken on the bill for advancement with no further debate.

SENATOR CLARK: All those in favor of the motion vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. It will take 30 votes.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? We are voting on the suspension of the rules to advance the bill with no further amendments. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 10 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The rules are suspended. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Move the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the advancement of 882. Do you want a machine vote?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: No, it is not debatable. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. It is not debatable. What are you for...?

SENATOR NEWELL: ...motion to suspend the rules to prevent any other amendments or to prevent debate?

SENATOR CLARK: The Clerk tells me it is not debatable. There is nothing, just to move the bill. That is what the motion was.

CLERK: It included references to precluding debate and no further amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote. Moving the bill to E & R. A record vote has been asked for. I was voting aye, Mr. Clerk. Have you got it?

CLERK: Yes, Senator Clark voting aye.
