I am going to ask unanimous consent to withdraw this particular amendment, with the understanding that we have targeted what money we believe we might have available, some twenty million, rather than the sixty that we passed, with the understanding that the twenty million will be approved, with the understanding that I think will cut about ten million off the Homestead here shortly, with the understanding that we will be extremely frugal with what we do on ADC because anything in excess of about 1.7 million is probably going to get vetoed. With those understandings, I personally, with the consent of Senator Marvel and Senator Johnson and Senator Lewis, am withdrawing that amendment at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is from Senator Wesely. It is on page 1590. It reads as follows: (Read the Wesely amendment as found on page 1590 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I would like to withdraw that amendment at this time pending the Warner amendment. So I will withdraw it at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, no objections, so ordered. What is the next item?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator DeCamp, Request 2309.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, that would be a variation of the Warner amendment. Rather than take it up, I would simply defer to Senator Warner's amendment which is precise, when it comes up, and for which he has the exact numbers on, and I would withdraw that one also.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely moves to amend by repealing the General Homestead Exemption for homeowners under 65.

SENATOR WESELY: I will withdraw that for the next amendment which does the same thing.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, so ordered.

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
