So again I don't think that we should attempt to be all things to all people, and I would hope that you would vote the Wesely amendment down.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature I would hope that Senator Wesely would withdraw this amendment. Since people contract this disease and between the time when they get it and the time when they are totally disabled it may be several years in length of time. So, Senator Wesely, I would ask if you wouldn't withdraw because the details are certainly not worked out so that all of these people that do know that they have and are not disabled it would be unfair to the rest of the public to have those people being exempt when the others are not. What do you say to that, Senator Wesely?

SENATOR WESELY: Well talk to Senator Pirsch, there is some language under that section that deals with a fact that when you have some other conditions you have to meet certain conditions which include not being able to get around and then have to use braces and that sort of thing, so I think there might be provision enough in there and if people are uncertain they can vote against the amendment. I think that we might as well go ahead and vote on it and see what we get.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? The question before the House is shall debate cease. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, debate ceases. Senator Wesely, you are recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: I will just reiterate again, what the amendment does is add to the list of disabilities that would qualify under the Homestead Exemption program to include progressive osteo-arthritis, there have been a number of concerns, I think litigimate that have been expressed about
