SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Warner amendment to 1004. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. We are voting on the adoption of the Warner amendment to 1004. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the Warner amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion passed. The amendment is adopted. Is there any further amendment?

CLERK: Yes, sir, Mr. President, Senator Schmit now moves to amend and the Schmit amendment is on page 1781 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I believe the hour is late. It is 10:54. We have spent an hour and a half or more on the previous bill. I do have some concern about this bill and the intent language I think needs to be clarified. I have discussed it with Senator Kremer and we have agreed on some of the provisions and some we did not agree upon but I think that it is late enough this year that I will ask unanimous consent to withdraw those amendments and take a look at it another time.

SENATOR CLARK: The amendment is withdrawn. Do you have any other amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Dworak.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Dworak. Is Senator Dworak in the House?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: We will take up the next amendment while we are waiting.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have two amendments to the Dworak amendment. Senator Cullan moves to amend the bill. (Read the Cullan amendment as found on page 1830 of the Legislative Journal.) That is offered by Senator Cullan.

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
