SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Next.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, before I get to the next bill, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined engrossed LB 647 and find the same correctly engrossed, 647A correctly engrossed and LB 1004 correctly engrossed. SPEAKER MARVEL: Now let's proceed with the next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are no E & R amendments to LB 361A. Senator Landis has amendments pending.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I waive. I withdraw any motions that I have on LB 361A.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp moves to amend LB 361A.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, you may have noted by this time that there is very little need for 361A for anything to do with gasoline. Therefore, I have got a better idea. The eminent domain issue in accordance with requests from Senator Kremer and Senator Dworak, the language is extremely specific in the amendment now that I am offering. It simply says essentially that fifty-one percent, if he wants to have absolute clarity, I think it is fifty-one percent, if that is for recreation that that would constitute a primary purpose. I am suggesting you amend this bill with this amendment and clear up the question of eminent domain with respect to Natural Resource Districts using it for essentially or strictly parks and recreational purposes. I think that diverts them from their real goal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Sieck. Senator Sieck, did you want the floor?

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to know whether this amendment would be germane to the bill, whether it is really germane.
