SENATOR CHAMBERS: I believe that. Can you pick out any bills from your study that you think would receive any substantial amending? I mean amendments that would be (interruption).

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, if you are talking about amendments for the purpose of making a necessary correction or something, there is only one really and I think they could live with that. However, you have got gobs of amendments to fight the water issue which can't be done now and you know that. I think everything else, if you passed it just as it is, I just talked, for example, to Senator Sieck on 643, the water bill. Passed in its present form it will accomplish the things they intend to do. So I think you could pass everything there is now, 865, a necessary bill. The amendments on there are simply to stall and force another issue. I think you could pass everything now and solve the problem.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Thank you, and members of the Legislature, when you can get Jesse James and the sheriff to agree, I am the sheriff, to agree on an issue, then I think you have a good one.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes. We are voting on the Chambers motion first. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. This is the Chambers amendment to the Koch motion. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: Senator Dworak, you requested a record vote? (Read record vote. See pages 1852 and 1853, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Just a minute. Senator Venditte, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, when I looked at the Board it said twenty-five, and then with the word "record", it went down to twenty-four, and I am just wondering, do we need twenty-five or twenty-four votes to pass this amendment or pass this motion?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell. Okay, you need twenty-five votes. You can't get by with twenty-four.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Well, then, Mr. Speaker, do we have twenty-four or is it twenty-five?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Twenty-five votes. The Chair is not going
