SPEAKER MARVEL: Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Record vote continued. 22 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Chambers motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion fails. Now we are voting on the Koch motion. Senator Koch, do you have any close?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I apologize for using up time. My intent was noble but oftentimes it doesn't show that. I tried to expedite and I am still going to try. I guess it takes thirty votes and I ask for the adoption of the rule for the remainder of the day just as we stated it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You are asking for a rule suspension. Okay, the motion takes thirty votes. Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I would like to know exactly what we are suspending and can I have time to go to the rule book and read the rule with you?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to read it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: We are suspending Rule 7, Section 3 and Rule 6, section 5, Senator. Seven, three and six, five, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, Mr. Chairman, what I am to understand then, and I hope everybody understands it, not subdivisions of these rules but the entire section in each case is suspended?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The first one is Rule 7, Section 3 (d). The second one...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it just 3 (d); 7, 3 (d) or all of Section 3?

CLERK: Senator, it is Rule 7, Section 3 (d) for the first one, d as in dog.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Only d?
