We didn't milk them until we got the bucket full and then just quit. Now I can tell you this right now. The people back home elected us to do a job down here, and if we can't get it done in sixty days, then let's go sixty-five days but I think we had plenty of it done at the end of fifty days but let's go ahead. Coming in here like Senator Koch is wanting to do and say, well, we will only talk about this one for five minutes or fifteen minutes when it requires two or three hours, when the discussion on that bill should be such that the people of this state and we understand them, and then you are going to come in and say, people, we are going to cut it short. I move for the extension of this session five days.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the Keyes amendment to extend this session five days. It requires forty votes to do it one day. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, to extend the session.

SENATOR CLARK: Another motion on the Board.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kelly moves to suspend Rules 5, Section 7, 3, Rule 6, Section 5 to take one vote to advance each bill from Select File to E & R for engrossment, no debate nor no amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: You have heard the motion. Is there any debate on it besides Senator Kelly?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, just to repeat, we had a motion that would be one vote to advance all of the bills on Select File to E & R engrossing failed. We had one we were going to debate each one fifteen minutes and advance it and that failed. We have got the target bracketed. This motion would be one vote on each bill, no amendments, no debate, to advance to E & R engrossing. I move adoption of the motion.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan. The question has been called for. I see five hands. The question is to cease debate. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? It takes thirty votes. It takes twenty-five votes to cease debate.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.
