LB 993, 998, 999, 1001

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 10 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. Senator Kelly, do you wish to close? Senator Kelly, do you wish to close? You have heard the motion. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. This will take thirty votes to suspend the rules. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 19 nays to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you got some things to read in? Go ahead.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined engrossed LB 993 and find the same correctly engrossed.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to adjourn until 9:00 a.m. tomorrow morning.

SPEAKER MARVEL: In the first place, Senator Haberman, before we put the question, will you agree to 8:30 a.m. since we need to start reading Final Reading at 8:30 a.m. with at least a quorum?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, I will. Mr. President, and fellow colleagues, we have tried everything else. We are tired. We are at a stalemate. I think if we just adjourn until 8:30 a.m. tomorrow morning things will be a lot better. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to adjourn until 8:30 a.m. tomorrow morning. Senator Goodrich, this is not debatable.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I know but a question of the Chair. For example, there is one of the bills in here, the Racing Commission, 939, that it means if we do not advance it today we lose five million dollars in revenue.
