LB 824, 820

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted, Senator Koch. Are there any other amendments?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: I move that LB 824 be advanced to E & R Final.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, have you got some motions on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Cullan, Chambers, Hoagland, Landis, Johnson, and Vickers move to adjourn.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It is not debatable. All those in favor of adjourning vote aye, opposed vote no. It is adjourning until eight-thirty tomorrow morning. Record the vote. Announce the vote.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 29 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The next bill is LB 820. What do you have, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 820. Mr. President, Senator DeCamp has a priority motion. He moves to pass over LB 820.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, the only reason I am doing this is to try to get things flowing. I am merely moving, which is a priority motion, the only way I could get to it, that we pass over 820 until we process the other things and then deal with 820. I am not trying to sabotage 820. I think it has to pass. I will be working for its passage. I think this is a reasonable way to approach this. I know that there are people here that intend to discuss this bill at great length before we ever, ever, ever reach a suspension of the rules motion and I think if we package things together properly here we can get the other bills moved, we can get them back here in time and we can still complete this session with some modicum of dignity or success and 820 then could rise or fall on its own merits. I am not trying to sabotage it.
