SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President and members of the body, I again stand opposed to the five member commission. I feel that with the three members if they are active and workers it will be just as good as a five member. I saw too many areas in the county...in the state where they have had five man county commissioners. They used to have three and they went to five and it just doesn't work. Senator Murphy says things are run by one man. I can't quite understand this because there are three members on that commission and I do feel that this should be proper. There are more racetracks than just the four or five. We have a lot more than that. So I still stick by the three member commission. I urge you to defeat the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before the House is to cease debate. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. Senator Murphy, do you wish to close? Senator Murphy, did you wish to close?

SENATOR MURPHY: I think I have presented what I believe to be a fair request for fair treatment by this body and I hope you will adopt that amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Murphy amendment. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Once more, have you all voted. Senator Murphy, I am going to call it.

SENATOR MURPHY: A Call of the House and a roll call vote, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All Senators return to their seats. Would you check in please? Would everyone
