But you have got to come here. Yes, you have got to be here for it. You stop by sometime and you will find that everyone of these bills have been debated till who wouldn't have it. You just drop by and we can give you all kinds of information on it. It is not a charade. It is an attempt to try and resolve some things on bills that have been debated. Senator Fitzgerald, my good friend, Fitz, these are bills on the list. Bills on the list that have been moved over to Select already. They are already in form, fine, it doesn't look like the motion is going to go, don't bother me, I just picked bills on here that I thought in conversation with others, had basically no amendments where there was an agreed upon understanding. The only two that I didn't pick were 306 and 175. Why? Look at your list, even Chris can read. It says, "Final Reading per attached sheet, and then, Select File for those two bills." They would have never come up under even the most remote conditions. So, that is why those two were left off. It is very simple. However, whatever.
