SENATOR MURPHY: If I may Mr. President, let me point out one thing which could be pitifully obvious in this whole proposition. If these people are to pay for this program, the total cost of this program themselves, then we have more insurance agencies in this state wanting to sell annuities on any basis in any quantity to anybody. If ever there was a flaw, and an obvious one, in asking for this kind of legislation it should be more than proven by this very fact. If they want additional coverage, they are totally entitled to do it, they can even get it in a tax free insurance policy as of this year. I suggest to you that this bill is not just the camel's nose, it is about three-quarters of the camel. I suggest that we very rapidly back away from it and not once again commit a subdivision of government to something that they not only do not want but to which they are objecting violently. I move the adoption of the kill motion.
