CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? It takes 30 votes. Record your vote.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I've got to have aoh, okay.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 7 nays Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: I still think I know what I am doing Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay.

SENATOR CLARK: The kill motion will be taken up now. Senator Dworak has the kill motion.

SENATOR DWORAK: After that last germane ruling Senator Clark I have some questions. I respectfully ask to withdraw the kill motion.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is withdrawn. Is there anything else on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is to advance the bill to Engrossing.
