SENATOR NEWELL: Do we need an A bill on this? It doesn't take effect until 81. It is \$4,000 times five, it is \$20,000, so it is under the \$50,000. Do we even need an A bill? Mr. Speaker?

SENATOR CLARK: Lets wait just a moment until we get a ruling here.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay.

SENATOR CLARK: Is Senator Warner in the room? Do we need an A bill in 872, it is \$20,000. \$25,000.

SENATOR NEWELL: It doesn't go into effect until 81 anyway. January 1, 1981 it goes into effect. Do we need an A bill on it? Yes, we do need an A bill. Senator DeCamp, your point is well taken. I think that is a great motion you have Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Venditte. The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? The question before the House is to cease debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Ahh, ahh, ahh, there is a second reason. You can't read bills on Final if there is an A bill pending. See, that is why you have to kill it or advance it. I'm suggesting that you advance it.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the suspension of the rules to take up the kill motion. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: It takes 30 votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 5 nays on the motion to suspend the rules and take up the kill motion Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Haberman, Senator Haberman, will you take up your kill motion now please. Senator Haberman.
