I think that they are one of the most essential industries, not only to Omaha but to all of the State of Nebraska. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want to withdraw your motion? The motion is withdrawn. Go ahead and read the bill. The Clerk will read 853.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 853 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. It is LB 853 on Final Reading. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1909 of the Legislative Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading, LB 853A.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Beutler moves to return LB 853 to Select File for a specific amendment, the amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I voted in favor of the main bill, 853. I think it is a very good bill except for one section and that is Section 14 of the bill. That is the bad apple in the barrel as far as I am concerned and I think it is a very bad apple. Let me make clear what I am doing with the A bill though. By killing the A bill we are not killing 853 except to the extent that we are rendering Section 14 ineffective because all of the money, all of the fiscal note required in this bill is required for the expenditures envisioned under Section 14 of the bill. So let me try to go back and distinguish for you what the bill does and how the main part of the bill differs from Section 14 which is what I want to get to. First of all, the bill generally,
