LB 940, 486

SENATOR CLARK: Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: No sir.

SENATOR CLARK: Read the bill.

CLERK: Read LB 940.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the passage of 940 with the emergency clause attached. All procedures of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Have you all voted? One more time. Record the votes.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 7 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting. (Vote appears on pages 1919-20 of the Legislative Journal).

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. Clerk will read 486.

CLERK: Mr. President. . . .

SENATOR CLARK: We have to suspend the rules to read these.

CLERK: Senator Marvel moves to suspend Rule 6, Section 7(b) so as to read LB 486-1002 on Final Reading today.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the suspension of the rules in order to read the bills today. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.

SENATOR CLARK: Rules are suspended and we will continue to read the bills. LB 486 first please.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp moves to return LB 486 to Select file for a specific amendment. The amendment being to strike the enacting clause.
