SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Once more, have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 41 ayes, 1 nay, 2 excused and not voting, 5 present and not voting. (Vote appears on page 1946 of the Legislative of the Legislative Journal).

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. I have been advised that we have 39 bills on Friday. We are going to start at 8:30 a.m.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I move to adjourn until 8:30, Friday morning, April 18th.

SENATOR CLARK: If you will hold it just a moment, we have got. . . we will have to wait just a moment until the bills are signed before they can go to the Governor. Senator Marvel. Senator Warner, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I have a resolution on the Clerk's desk. I would move to suspend the appropriate rule assigned to take it up today. All the resolution does is a request from the Legislature as a whole to the Department of Revenue inquiring if they would report back to the Clerk by 5:00 p.m. Thursday if they anticipate any change in their predictions on receipts or amount of refund so that the Legislature would have that information Friday should you chose to want it. There has been a lot of concern expressed about what may happen to the economy and I think that we all have that concern. If they have any additional information that would be helpful for the body. I think it would be nice to have it, and it also indicates that they have. . . are not in the position. . . that there is no change in their estimates that we have received to date then all they need to do is state that there is no change.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the suspension of the rules to take the resolution up today. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.
