

he finds there, arrest the ad seller, arrest the printer, arrest everybody whose hands this information passed through? It is not there. Another point that I think ought to be made about this bill is that it is not just the Drug Paraphernalia Act that the Justice Department drafted up. It is an attempt to incorporate into existing Nebraska law the provisions of this monstrosity and something that ought to be of concern to the rest of you who care about the Constitution. It allows seizure of material without a search warrant. Now there was a recent U.S. Supreme Court decision that said arrests cannot be made without a warrant. Now some searches have been allowed, people thought, without warrants and those kind of laws were struck down. Now what you are doing by taking the definition of drug paraphernalia and incorporating it into the present law, you are allowing all of these defined objects to justify an officer in entering premises where those objects are found and making an arrest without a warrant. You are expanding considerably the law of the state right now that relates to warrantless searches and the warrantless search is probably suspect but who cares about the Constitution? Now, Senator Nichol, Section 8 of your bill at line 10 on page 6....

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, you have one minute left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, deals with the warrantless searches, then on page 7 because the time is running out and I don't know whether Senator Wesely wants to take a long time expounding on the subject matter, I will yield to him what remaining time I have after I make this one point. This bill is not being passed to attack the drug problem. It is strictly an attempt to, I think, make political hay and I am going to hand around a list who a certain organization is giving campaign contributions to and then we will see who is giving campaign contributions based on this bill, Senator Pat Venditte.

PRESIDENT: All right, the remaining half minute, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, you have heard now, I think, extended debate, I think, of excellent debate dealing with the major points of the bill, the constitutional problems, a lot of the other concerns that members of this Legislature have. You have before you a copy of the Attorney General's opinion on the bill as drafted which shows it is still unconstitutional. That information is there for you to review and I will withdraw my motion at this time and let's go ahead and vote on the bill.
