LR 327, 328

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of LR 327,  
Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The resolution is  
adopted. Now we go to LR 328.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 328. Read. It is found on  
page 1496.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, colleagues, this gives

SENATOR NEWELL: Well, I mean if you are patting them on the  
back for doing a great job in being extra conservative (inter-  
ruption).

SENATOR HABERMAN: (Interruption) I don't know (interruption).

SPEAKER MARVEL: One at a time.

SENATOR NEWELL: Is Senator Warner here? Well, I just  
want to say it is my understanding that the State Board,  
the Board of Trustees, State Colleges got the highest per-  
centage of increase of any other institution and I think
