CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 2022, Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 16 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill becomes law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor. Senator Fitzgerald, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker, members, could I have a point of personal privilege?

SPEAKER MARVEL: State your point to the Chair please.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: I have a thing on my desk here that has got Confidential on it and I would like to ask Senator Chambers a question. It will only take a moment, sir. Would you yield to a question, Senator Chambers? Senator Chambers, I have this thing here that has got Confidential. Now who is this group here? The Nebraska Political Action Council and who do they represent and I see that they are going against Amendment #2.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, it says in the upper left hand corner it is the Nebraska Association of Commerce and Industry and you are correct. They are not going to support this Amendment #2.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Thank you, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right, thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch moves that pursuant to Rule 6, Section 4, the Legislature override the Governor's line item veto of the State Department of Education, Program 143, State Aid to the School Fund Services and the Reserve Teacher Act contained in subsections (C) and (D) of subsection (1) of Section 6 on pages 4 and 5.
