CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Debate ceases. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Here is the opportunity for this legislative body along with the Governor to really cast a vote for quality education and property tax relief which will be meaningful. If we don't accept it, then we have merely provided what I think is a misleading kind of action to the public. If you want to make it realistic and dramatic, then this is the proper step to take and I ask for your support on this amendment to 1002. Thank you. Are we under Call, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Technically, yes, but not actually. Do you want to go under Call?

SENATOR KOCH: Let's try it, just in case.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Shall the Legislature go under Call? All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are under Call. Please record your presence. Senator Burrows, Senator Landis, Senator Cope, Senator Wesely, Senator DeCamp, Senator Chambers. Every one is present, Senator Koch except Senator Chambers. Do you want to read the motion? Senator Koch, what is the amount involved? Forty million. Okay. The motion has to do with whether the bill becomes law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor. We are talking about 1002 and we are talking about forty million dollars. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Is that forty million dollars in addition to the twenty million dollars that (interruption).

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR LAMB: That is a total of sixty million dollars then.

SENATOR KOCH: If we adopt this measure, you would have sixty million new dollars total.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.
