SPEAKER MARVEL: I wish to alert the Legislature to the fact that before the week is out and certainly by the first of next week we must take time to analyze the Rules that we have adopted, the Rules that are proposed, so that we can keep on top of this Rules issue. We have two basic books that we are using now and I recommend to you first of -all the blue copy of the Rules and that you check that and also the green copy. Actually the blue copy takes over from the green copy, and I will assure you of one thing that by the first of the week we will try to have for you a rather comprehensive discussion of Rules, Rules proposed and Rules passed. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now the motion before the House is the adoption of temporary Rules for this day only, I believe. Is that the way the motion was read, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: And so that is the only motion before the House. We will go to the board for a vote. All those in favor vote aye, opposed may. Record the vote.

CLERK: 45 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of temporary Rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is approved. The temporary Rules are adopted and the Chair recognizes Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Mr. President, I move that we appoint Mr. Patrick J. O'Donnell as temporary Clerk of the Legislature, and Mr. Ray Wilson as temporary Sergeant at Arms.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to appoint the temporary officers, the Clerk and the Sergeant at Arms. Any further discussion? All those in favor of that motion to appoint the temporary officers signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. The motion carries and the temporary officers are appointed. The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: (Microphone not on) to the Committee on Credentials, who will fortwith report to the Legislature on the credentials of those claiming to be elected to the Legislature in the General Election in November, 1980.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion is to nominate a Committee on Credentials or to elect nominations first. Proceed with the election. So the question is at this point to proceed to the election. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. Now we are to elect the Committee on Credentials. All right, I think the Clerk does
