SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature. first of all I was not present the day the bill was heard and when the amendments were offered so Senator Dworak and Senator Hoagland, the introducers of the amendments that were adopted by the committee, may want to add to what I am going to say as I move for the adoption of the committee amendments, and there are two of them. The first was offered by Senator Dworak and what it would do, it would increase the learners' permit and the school permit from \$1 to \$3 which then, of course, would result in costing more than the duplicate permit that was issued at \$2 which was questionable in years gone by. So all that amendment does is it increases the learner's permit and the school permit from \$1 to \$3. I think this was brought to our attention when we were discussing another bill several days ago. Mr. Chairman, shall we split the two amendments or take them both at the same time?

## SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: Do it at the same time if you would like.

SENATOR KREMER: The second amendment that was brought to us by Senator Hoagland eliminates some language that could be potentially confusing and it relates to a person that may be out of the state and he loses his license and he can under the provision of this amendment ask for a temporary permit. The present language in the bill says if he is unable to be present in the State of Nebraska to get a driver's license. The words "unable" have been stricken tecause it can mean most anything. So that is what the second amendment does, it strikes this language that could be confusing, namely, "unable to be present". The first amendment increases the fees. I move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion carries. The amendments are adopted. Senator Rumery, what do you want to do with the bill? We have one motion on the deck. Read the motion.
