LB 67, 77, 80

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Now, Senator Kahle, do you want to move the bill back? Advance the bill.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I now move once more to move LB 38 to E & R for Engrassment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no....say aye. Opposed no. The motion....does somebody want a machine vote? The motion is carried. The bill is readvanced. The next item. We go back now to Final Reading and the Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 67.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 67 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 709 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 46 ayes, 2 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The next bill, LB 77 on Final Reading.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 77 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Clerk, record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 710 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 47 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with emergency clause attached. Before we go to the next bill, in the north balcony from Senator Landis' District fifty-five 4th Grade students from Belmont School, Lincoln, Nebraska, Kathy Kubik and Orline Sidman, teachers. Will you raise your hands so we can see where you are? Good morning. The Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 80.
