that these companies that do business in other states must make a filing with that insurance commissioner, and if they are a nonadmitted company, that that requires another kind of license and we are not eliminating that requirement. That is a surplus lines license. So we are really talking about only those companies that have prior filing in the states they are doing business with. Okay?

SENATOR VICKERS: Thank you, Senator Dworak. That was one of my concerns. It seems to me that we have had in the past, at least in life insurance, agents coming from God knows where into Nebraska selling life insurance and I wanted to make sure we weren't opening that door to that other set of insurance agents also. Thank you, Senator Dworak.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now before we advance the bill, the Public Health and Welfare will meet under the South balcony at 10:30 a.m. for a short meeting. The motion is the advancement of LB 425 to E & R for Review. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARYEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 194.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 194 was a bill introduced by Senator Robert Clark. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 15, referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. I have no amendments on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President and members, this is a very simple bill. What it does is allow the city council or the village board to pass one ordinance one time, and if they ever want to change it, they can change it at a future date, as to how they either want to appoint or elect a library board. Right now they have to do this every two years. It is not only costly, time consuming. I think that Senator Hoagland has an amendment to the bill to take out some obsolete language and I will certainly agree to that, and I would move that it goes to E & R Initial.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hoagland moves to amend the bill. (Read Hoagland amendment found on page 781, Legislative Journal.) Is that right, Senator? Okay.
