the report of Senator DeCamp's Committee vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 mays on adoption of the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee report, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee report is adopted. The next committee gubernatorial appointment report is by the Judiciary Committee. The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I move for the approval of the report of the Judiciary Committee on the reappointment of Mr. Verne Moore, Jr. of Omaha, Nebraska who has been serving on the Crime Victim's Reparation Board for the past two years and was instrumental in setting it up at its inception and he is being recommended for a period of six more years. Mr. Chairman, I move for the approval of the report.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on the Judiciary Committee report? If not, all those in favor of adopting the Judiciary Committee report on gubernatorial appointments, all those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 mays on adoption of the Judiciary Committee report, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the Judiciary Committee report on gubernatorial appointments is adopted. The next report is by the Business and Labor Committee on their gubernatorial appointments. The Chair recognizes Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that the appointment of Richard L. Berkheimer for a Judge of the Commission of Industrial Relations be approved by the Legislature. Mr. Berkheimer is an attorney here in Lincoln and he appeared before the committee on March 18th and the committee voted unanimously to approve Mr. Berkheimer. I move that he be appointed.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on the Business and Labor Committee report? If not, the question is the adoption of the Business and Labor Committee report by Senator Maresh. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.
