SPEAKER MAPVEL: Okay, the next bill is LB 35.
CLERK: Mr. President, LB 35 was introduced by Senator Vickers and Senator Von Minden. (Title read.) The bill was first read on January 3, referred to the Public Wcrks Comittee. The bill was advanced to General File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator rickers, do you wish to explain the bill?

SENATOR VICKERS: Thank ycu, Mr. Speaker and members. LB 35 is without a doubt the shortest bill I have ever introduced in this bodv. At least it should pet a mark of "A" for brevity as far as reading is concerned and you certainly could not tell by reading the $6 i l l$ what it does so I will explain it to you. I am sure most of you know already. LB 35 does one thing pure and simple. It eliminates the Motor Vehicle Inspection Protram in the State of Nebraska and in order to make myself very clear at the outset, for the record, I want it to be known that I am not for carnaje on the hiphways. I am for safety. I am for anything that we san do to cut down on the traffic fatalities out there on the highways of the State of Nebraska but on the other hand, I am opposed to overregulation of the Deople of the State of Nebraska unless it is demonstrated that there is, in fact, a need for that regulation and that that requlation is accomplishing something. The repulation imposed by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Propram which has been in operation for a ifttie over ten year period, from the information that I have been able to assimilate has not accomplished the desired poals when it was implemented. I think it is a perfect example of tine government instipatinf somethin that sounds preat, looks like it ought to really work but in reality, it has not worked. You have passed out before you on your desk a chart with some information on it. That information, if you will study it, indicates that for the ten year period prior to the inception of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program and the ten year period following the inception of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Propram, the number on accidents per million miles travelled in the state of Nebraska is exactly the same for a ten year period. Remembering that durlne this ten year period, the last ten year period, we also nad the 55 mile speed limit which most people would readily assume and I yculd agree to that that it has cut down on accidents to some degree since speed is one of the hipher causes o: accidents. Also we have had the interstate riphway system completed in the State of Mebrasia during that period of time as opposed to the ten year period previous to that and I think most people also would aree that the
