SPEAKER MARVEL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, as you know, 40 is ready for Final and I just think it would be good to clear the air and get this one out of the way and I think the cowboys are ready to get this issue settled and just get the till passed in its present form. And I would urge you just to get it over with. It would take about three or four minutes to read it, or less. We'd get this one out of the way.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to suspend the rules and take up the bill. Sir?

SENATOR DWCRAK: On Final Realing? The motion is to move a bill on Final Reading and it's not on the schedule?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to suspend the rules so it can be considered on Final Reading. That's the issue.

SENATOR DWORAK: And read...the normal process of Final Reading at three minutes to twelve.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir. Senator Hoagland. This is a debatable motion.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would just like to rise briefly in support of this motion, Mr. Speaker.
