PRESIDENT: Yes.



PRESIDENT: The Speaker moves to recess until 1:30. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. I am going to go to the board. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26-11, Mr. President, on the motion to recess.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. We are recessed until 1:30.
