SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I would like to ask Senator Haberman a question.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Have you checked whether this amendment would be constitutional when you are just signaling out the constitutional officers on the state level?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well it includes other than constitutional officers if they are state appointed and state elected.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Well how about the school board?

SENATOR HABERMAN: They are not covered.

SENATOR LABEDZ: And no city officials, no county officials?

SENATOR HABERMAN: That is correct. I do have an amendment that does cover the county officials if you would like it better, up at the desk, Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Well I was just concerned whether or not your amendment would be constitutional and I just wanted that in the record. Thank you, Senator Haberman.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wiitala.

SENATOR WIITALA: Mr. Speaker, I would move the previous question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The previous question has been... All those in favor of the previous question vote aye, opposed vote no, couldn't think of the word.
